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The enormous development in the means of transferring information resulted in creating overlapping commercial relationships on the international level, which participated in creating a fertile environment for exercising infringements of intellectual property rights. Hence, it has become necessary for states and international organisations interested in this subject to find protective methods for these rights through adopting mechanisms for resolving the disputes arising from them. Based on this, WIPO has set up an alternative dispute resolution method through establishing the WIPO Arbitration and Mediation Centre (WIPO Centre). This article concentrates on the mediation approved by the WIPO Centre as one of the alternative dispute resolution methods in respect of intellectual property rights, through explaining its general framework and, thereafter, showing its role in the settlement of those disputes, relying on the rules of mediation adopted by the WIPO Centre and those adopted by the Jordanian Mediation (Civil Disputes Settlement) Act 2006.

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
